
# ~I-Pal Kagawa~ News from the Library ★We've purchased study materials for the Japanese Language Proficiency Test (JLPT).

Hey everyone, did you know that 2010 is the "National Year of Reading?" This season is called "Autumn Reading," and the long autumn nights are great for reading.

Did you know that there's a library in the basement of I-Pal Kagawa? There are about 2,300 books in various languages about things like Japanese culture, and there are about 2,000 books in Japanese about foreign topics. And because there were format changes in the JLPT in 2009, we have purchased about 100 books, designed for studying the new format, which you can read in the library or check out and take home.

When you make a library card, you can check out 2 books for 2 weeks. In order to make a library card, you must have proof of identification.





# Tadotsu Japanese Exchange Association, "Taniko"

"Taniko" is a combination of the "Ta" from Tadotsu, "Ni" from nihongo (Japanese), and "Ko" from kouryu (exchange). Taniko began four years ago when its creators wanted to participate in exchange in Japanese with people from various countries who were married and living in the area or studying trade skills. At each meeting, there are between 10 and 15 students and volunteers, and there are all levels of Japanese ability among the students. Depending on the student's goals and necessity, study plans will be designed with individual consideration given to each person's ability. We can also give guidance for studying for the Japanese Language Proficiency Test (JLPT). Recently, we have also had participation from children who work together and do things like homework. Trainees usually have a visa for 3 years which means there is a high turnover rate, so we also do things like have potluck parties and participate in local festivals in order to actively promote exchange in the community. It's important to have a harmonious and fun learning environment. We currently meet once every month, but would like to gradually increase the number of times we meet.

Japanese Speech Contest


